1. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS: COMPLETE this application and the enclosed college card, two admission data cards, and self-addressed forms. Please print in ink or type and complete all pages. - d) The Self-Addressed Forms with all of the address blanks completed. Use the address at which you wish to be notified in each instance. Leave dates blank. On the Application for Admission Status Report list: schools attended, LSAT dates and name(s) of reference(s). The Acknowledgment of Application for Admission and Fee will be returned to you indicating the date on which these items were received by our office. We shall endeavor to send the remaining forms to you as the need arises; however, the applicant is ultimately responsible for the completion of his file.
- e) A \$10. check or money order payable to "Rutgers—The State University" in payment of the non-refundable application fee.

2. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS:

- a) RECOMMENDATIONS: As you will note, you should have the enclosed recommendation form completed by your College Advisor, Chairman of the Pre-Law Committee, or the Dean of Students (or equivalent officer) of your most recent undergraduate college. In addition, applicants who have already graduated from college should arrange to have appropriate recommendations forwarded to the Admissions Office (e.g. most recent employer, Commanding Officer, Graduate School Advisor, Peace Corps Supervisor, etc.)
- b) LAW SCHOOL ADMISSION TEST: Arrange to take the LSAT by writing to "Law School Admission Test, Educational Testing Service, Box 944, Princeton, N. J., 08540," for an application form and Bulletin of Information. The Committee on Admissions recommends that the test be taken by February. If you find it necessary to postpone taking the test until April, please so inform the Admissions Secretary and have all of your other credentials on file by the date of the test. A transcript of your score on the LSAT should be sent directly from Educational Testing Service. In most cases, the LSAT score will be reported to the School of Law together with the LSDAS Report (See c.)
- c) TRANSCRIPTS: The applicant should register with the Law School Data Assembly Service (LSDAS) by completing the

registration form found in the LSAT Bulletin of Information, and returning it to "Law School Data Assembly Service, Educational Testing Service, Box 944, Princeton, New Jersey 08540." In addition, request the Registrar of each college and each graduate and professional school you have attended to send a transcript, not to the law school, but directly to: LSDAS. The transcript(s) will be analyzed and copies of all transcripts will be forwarded to our school and to other law schools designated by the applicant, which are also participants in the LSDAS. Transcripts covering courses not completed at the time of application must be forwarded directly to LSDAS as soon as they become available. Transcripts should be submitted to Law School only in response to a special request.

- 3. FINANCIAL AID: An applicant wishing to apply for financial aid should register with the Law School Financial Aid Service (LSFAS) by completing the registration form found in the LSAT Bulletin of Information, and returning it to "LSFAS, Educational Testing Service, Box 944, Princeton, New Jersey 08540."
- 4. INTERVIEWS: It is the policy of the Committee on Admissions not to attempt to evaluate an applicant through a personal interview. Special circumstances, however, may cause the Committee to request your appearance for an interview. If you would like to visit the Law School either to learn more about it or about the study of law, or for counseling, we will provide a member of the faculty or staff to talk with you. When considering an application we attempt not to use information, either favorable or unfavorable, learned in such meetings.
- 5. STATE BAR ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: Many states have special requirements for admission to the practice of law, such as registration prior to beginning the study of law, citizenship requirements, and evidence of good character. These requirements for all states can be found in "Rules for Admission to the Bar" published by the West Publishing Co., Saint Paul 2, Minnesota, or from the clerk of the highest court or the Board of Bar Examiners in any particular jurisdiction.
If you intend to take the New Jersey Bar Examination, you should apply for a New Jersey Prelegal Qualifying Certificate, which is issued by the Office of Pre-Professional Certification, State Department of Education, P.O. Box 2019, 225 West State Street, Trenton, New Jersey 08625. Ask your college Registrar to send a final transcript of your record to the Office of Pre-Professional Certification and, at the same time, write to the Office stating that you plan to enter law school, enclose the required fee of five dollars (in the form of a money order or certified check payable to the Commissioner of Education), and request issuance of the Certificate. The Certificate is not required for admission to the Law School.
